Series of the week ... Deltora Quest (by Emily Rodda)


The Deltora Quest is a collective title for three series of children's fantasy books comprised of: Deltora Quest, Deltora Shadowlands and Dragons of Deltora, also titled Deltora Quest 1, 2 and 3 respectively. Ideally, the three series should be read in order.

<u>Deltora Quest 1</u> follows the adventures of three companions - Lief, Jasmine and Barda - as they journey across the land of Deltora endeavoring to save it by recovering the magical Belt of Deltora and defeating the allies of the evil Shadow Lord.

In Deltora Quest 2, Lief, Jasmine and Barda must rescue thousands of Deltorans enslaved in the Shadowlands by

finding a weapon powerful enough to combat the Shadow Lord's magic. According to legend, the only thing the Shadow Lord fears is the fabled Pirran Pipe. But does the mysterious Pipe still exist? And if it does, what dangers will the companions have to face to find it?

<u>In Deltora Quest 3</u>, the three companions must once again save Deltora, this time from the Four Sisters, evil creations of the Shadow Lord. Their only hope of help lies with seven unlikely allies - the last of Deltora's dragons.
