We have sport presentations instead of assembly in the morning.





Premier's Reading Challenge

Just a reminder the Victorian Premier's Reading Challenge has started and it's great to see some of our students already logging their reading. All student accounts can be accessed via

www.education.vic.gov.au/prc. From here, you will need to go to student login and enter your child's username and password. All usernames begin with your child's year level (two digits beginning with



zero for foundation - 00, 01, 02, 03, 04, 05 and 06), followed by your child's first name (first letter is a capital) and last name initial (also a capital). So for example, if I was in foundation my username would be 00LindaM. All passwords are the child's teacher name followed by 1234 (all lowercase). For example marr1234, haase1234 etc. Passwords can be changed when you first login. If you have any questions or are having trouble logging in, please contact our Librarian.

Alternatively, you can grab a reading checklist from either the reception area or the library and hand into the library when completed.


