Dear Parents and Friends of the SMJ Community,

On last week's newsletter you would have noticed the code and instructions for booking a 'Student Led' Conference in the last week of this term.

For those who are new to our school this year, and maybe for some of you who have been with us for some time, I thought this week would be a good time to provide information that explains the advantages of these conferences.

From the time students join us in their learning journey in Prep, through to when they leave at the end of Grade 6, we aim to give the learner increasing responsibility and ownership for their learning. This is so they can develop into independent, life-long learners. One of the best ways we can involve students in their own learning is to have them conduct and participate in a 'Student-Led Conference'. This means that each child conducts a discussion with a family member/s and their teacher, and be part of the discussion group.

A 'Student-Led Conference' is an authentic way to encourage the students to take responsibility for their own learning, actions and decisions. This process also demonstrates to the students that we positively support their learning and acknowledges the value we place on their views and the respect we have for their opinions. It also clearly demonstrates that, together, we will support their learning and celebrate their achievements.

We also acknowledge that there may be some matter that parents particularly wish to discuss without their child's presence. If this is the case we ask that you make an alternate appointment with the teacher.


