SHERMAN LEARNING COMMUNITY (FOUNDATION)

Today in Math we started to learn about 'full' and 'empty'. We used cups of sand and matched them with their correct labels including 'almost full', 'half full' and 'almost empty'. We have also been working hard on consonant vowel consonant (CVC) words in our reading and writing. These are words that start with a consonant, have a vowel in the middle and another consonant at the end.

Examples of these words include "cat" "mum" and "top". This has been a big focus during our shared and guided reading sessions. The children are getting very good at spotting these words in the books that they are reading. They might be able to point them out to you in their readers at home too!



LYNCH LEARNING DOMMUNITY (3/4)

This week we have been finishing our celebrations booklets. Last Friday was Book Week. On book day every one dressed up as amazing things like Where's Wally. We had a massive parade. I was Darth Vader and Cameron was the amazing Space boy, it was great. This week Mini Vinnies are going to do a presentation about the bread tag collection. We have been working on analogue and digital times. One activity that has been challenging was the online game called Bang on Time, you have to stop the

MADDEN LEARNING COMMUNITY (5/6)

On Monday we practised our spelling. In performing arts we played what are you doing? This is a game where we had to act out an action or words and another person would mirror it. In math, we looked pre assessment for multiplication and division topics. In literacy we learned more about William Bligh, we also focused on commas and plurals.

On Tuesday, we learnt about the diamond division method. In literacy, we continued on with William Bligh and main and subordinate clauses. In resilience project, the Year 6's sixes looked at emotions and how to act appropriately. The Year 5's looked at sportsmanship. We also continued on with spelling and new types of prayer include fire prayer and pipe cleaners prayer.

Yesterday we had spelling and a whole school learning community meeting (revs and reminders) to address behaviours in the space. In sport we played baseball. In Indonesian we made puppets and in Art, we did embroidery sewing.

Today in Math, we continued to look at the diamond method of division so that we know more than one method to do division. After recess, we completed a post-assessment for money. In literacy, we worked on manipulating sentences but cutting them up and rewording them. In the afternoon we looked at the stewardship of the environment.
